## + The Prophecy of Isaiah

Isaiah 53:6-7 is read:

We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and YHVH has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and afflicted, yet He did not open His mouth; He was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so He did not open His mouth.

## + The Declaration of John

(The Immerser)

John 1:28-29; 35-36 is read:

This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

The next day John saw Yeshua coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of YHVH, who takes away the sin of the world! ...

The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. When he saw Yeshua passing by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of YHVH!"

## + The Presentation of Yeshua

Zechariah 9:9 and Matthew 21:1-3; 6-9 is read:

Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Yeshua sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt by her. Untie them and bring them to Me. If anyone says anything to you, tell him that the LORD needs them, and he will send them right away."

The disciples went and did as Yeshua had instructed them. They brought the donkey and the colt, placed their cloaks on them, and Yeshua sat on them.

A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of Him and those that followed shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" "Blessed is He who comes in the name of YHVH!" "Hosanna in the highest!"

## + The Revelation to John

(the Beloved Disciple)

Revelation 5:6-10 is read:

Then I saw a Lamb, looking as if It had been slain, standing in the center of the throne, encircled by the four living creatures and the elders. He had seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of YHVH sent out into all the earth.

He came and took the scroll from the right hand of Him who sat on the throne.

And when he had taken it, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each one had a harp and they were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.

And they sang a new song: *All read:* 

"You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because You were slain, and with Your Blood You purchased men for YHVH from every tribe and language and people and nation.

You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to serve our GOD, and they will reign on the earth."
