+ Lighting the Second Chanukah Candle

The second candle is lit with the Shamach candle and then the previous candle.

the continual wickedness and rebellion of mankind forced YHVH to wash the world clean.

But YHVH in faithfulness and love preserved Noah and his family, thus guaranteeing that His Promise to mankind would not end.

+ Lighting the Third Chanukah Candle

The third candle is lit with the Shamach candle and then the previous candles are lit (left to right).

The Reader says:



As we light this third candle,
we remember that in the
Third Great Day

Abraham was called out of idolatry by YHVH to walk in His Way.

And YHVH in faithfulness and love added greatly to the Promise He had made to mankind.

Abraham would be the physical father to a great people and the spiritual father of all who would believe the Word of YHVH.

+ Lighting the Fourth Chanukah Candle

The fourth candle is lit with the Shamach candle and then the previous candles are lit (left to right).

The Reader says:



As we light this fourth candle,
we remember that in the
Fourth Great Day

David was anointed by YHVH to be King of Israel while he was yet in his father's house.

The anointing was never removed though David sinned greatly.

But David genuinely repented of his sin and YHVH in faithfulness and love promised that a descendent of David would sit on the throne of Israel forever.

+ Lighting the Fifth Chanukah Candle

The fifth candle is lit with the Shamach candle and then the previous candles are lit (left to right).

The Reader says:



As we light this fifth candle,
we remember that just before the
beginning of the Fifth Great Day

the very Word of YHVH was made flesh. It was during Chanukah that the angel Gabriel appeared to Miriam to declare that she would bear The One and Only Promised Son.

So YHVH in faithfulness and love provided His Son as the Kinsman Redeemer for all mankind.

+ Lighting the Sixth Chanukah Candle

The sixth candle is lit with the Shamach candle and then the previous candles are lit (left to right).

The Reader says:



As we light this sixth candle,
we remember that in the
Sixth Great Day, as in the Fifth,

Ruach HaKodesh is able to live in us.

Yeshua promised us that when we received Him as our Savior and LORD, we have only to ask Him and He sends Ruach HaKodesh to us to live in us.

+ Lighting the Seventh Chanukah Candle

The seventh candle is lit with the Shamach candle and then the previous candles are lit (left to right).

The Reader says:



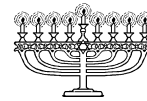
As we light this seventh candle,
