+ The Four Cups of Wine for Pesach

Father:

As YHVH spoke these words of encouragement to Moses, He revealed to His servant the plan by which He would redeem the Children of Israel.

* Response *

"I will bring you out from under the yoke of the Egyptians -- I will free you from being slaves,

I will redeem you with an outstretched arm --

I will take you as My own people, and I will be your GOD"

At Pesach, we celebrate by drinking from our cups four times. The first cup is **Sanctification**, showing that we set ourselves aside for YHVH's purpose only. The second cup is **Deliverance**, the third is **Redemption**, and the fourth is the **Praise** cup of the Kingdom. With each cup, we will remember the intimate union that YHVH desires with each of us.



+ The Cup of Sanctification - Kiddush

Father:

Water was added to the wine of Yeshua's day. As we add water to this first cup we remember the blood and water that flowed from the altar of YHVH into the Kidron Valley as the priests washed the altar after the sacrifices.

(The first cup of wine and water is poured, and in Elijah's cup.) We lift our first cup and bless the name of YHVH!

* Response *

Blessed are You, O YHVH our GOD, King of the universe and eternity, Who creates the fruit of the vine. (All drink.)

+ Washing the Hands - Rachtzah

Father:

(Lifts the basin of water.)

Blessed are You, O YHVH our GOD,

King of the universe and eternity,

Who has sanctified us through Yeshua Your Son,

in Whom is our Righteousness.

Let us share in the washing ceremony.

(Pass the bowl of water and towel.)

We remember that Yeshua fulfilled a condition of the Blood Covenant, when at His Last Meal, He laid aside His garments and girded Himself with a towel, the garment of a servant.

"After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash His disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around Him. Yeshua said...'He who is bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all of you.' 'Do you understand what I have done for you?', He asked them. 'You call Me "Teacher" and "LORD", and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your LORD and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet.'" (John 13:5, 10, 12-14)

Father:

(Lifts the fourth and final cup.)

A time is coming when Yeshua HaMashiach, our Kinsman Redeemer, will drink this cup with us and His Kingdom will be established forever!

Let us lift our cups and bless the Name of YHVH!

* Response *

Blessed are You, O YHVH our GOD, King of the universe and eternity, Who creates the fruit of the vine. (All drink.)

Father:

Our Pesach is now complete, just as our redemption is now forever complete. Our Bridegroom has departed, but His Spirit is with us continually. May it be soon that The Father sends Yeshua for us. Let us conclude with the wish that we may celebrate Pesach with our Beloved Kinsman Redeemer in our Father's House.

Come, LORD Yeshua --Our Beloved Kinsman Redeemer! Amen!
